In addition to our programs from JK to Grade 5, we have two(2) Primary Autism Transition Programs, the Mild Intellectual Disability Junior Program, Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program, and a Home School Program. We are a single Administrator school with 21 teachers and 15 support staff on site.
