MO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Presentation: What's Cool in Schools <ol style="list-style-type: none"> New forms of learning will require new spatial conditions alongside the traditional teacher fronted rooms All spaces in a school will be learning spaces Schools and their extended communities will share resources extensively Rapidly changing technology infuses all of these considerations New models for learning - The traditional model of the factory for learning. A new model for learning includes collaboration, project-based learning, mentoring, etc. A school can be a place that does not separate learning by school hours but instead integrates the student life with learning with a variety of types, be it one on one, quiet or active. Built Form Frameworks for Learning Examples: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - High-Tech High, Los Angeles - Kids have the opportunity for hands on learning - Delft Montessori, The Netherlands - Making learning zones - Harbour City School, Duluth, Michigan – The school is located in a tower and depends on the city for other spaces such as the YMCA for a gymnasium - Hip Hop High, Los Angeles - A high-school for students that were on the verge of dropping out and required special programs. Recording studios were introduced into an industrial building to engage students. Instead of a traditional classroom the students are part of groups, each with a mentor. It was also seen as important that each student has their own space rather than a locker. - The International School, The Hague, Netherlands – Contains interconnection of spaces and this space can be appropriated into a forum - Millennium High School, New York – portfolio based learning with flexible teaching spaces and the application of private sector lessons Orestad College, Copenhagen - Aims to strengthen and renew students' professional capabilities at the secondary level, to prepare students for university Zoo School, Minnesota - Unique partnership with a focus on mentorship & internship programs Galilee Catholic Learning Community, Aldinga, Australia - A welcoming, faith-centered environment for life-long learning Georgetown School, Grand Cayman Island - A community hub, community services hub, and health-care Agile Furnishings – Chairs on wheels and tables that change height and can be grouped and ungrouped Vittra, Stockholm - No structured classrooms but a warehouse for 	

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	learning. Emphasis on curiosity and creativity. Classes not by age but groups comprised of students of similar ability	
SP	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Next Steps – If there is support from the Design Team then there is enough information to move through the next stages of the process to move towards June Board Approval. After this meeting we will meet with the Councillor & City Planning. 	
PCe	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> How much money is required and does there need to be this amount of development on the site? 	
SP	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The School Board is directed on how it disposes of property by the Ministry. The Ministry will not support those living in rich neighbourhoods within the province getting better schools. The TDSB is trying to grow its capital fund and the School Board is willing to recommend that this building envelope is adequate to support the 5 year capital budget, which is the broader capital build program that TDSB Board looks to. 	
TM PC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What are the numbers for the school? And for the development? The development would be over 300,000 SF 	
SP	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We are giving the development industry an envelope to build within When it comes through for rezoning there is another process with the City. At this point there is a much broader city consultation process. 	
PCe	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I still feel a little uncomfortable about the precedent that is being set with potentially 30 storeys – this could open up taller buildings at the corner of Yonge/Davisville. 	TDSB
SP	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Similar to at NTCI, if it makes this group feel more comfortable we can establish a maximum GFA that we would not exceed. 	
TM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> That would be good - then you have the flexibility within the limits. I am more comfortable with that. 	
MO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We are interested in a flexible framework for the future developer to work with. 	
TM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I applaud the efforts in trying to humanize Davisville Avenue and offer improvements along this street edge.
