## OUR SCHOOL

**Curriculum Leader: Craig Morrison**

Oasis Alternative Secondary School provides continuous intake, social justice focused programs for at-risk youth who have struggled in mainstream school settings.

**Arts and Social Change Program:** The Arts & Social Change Program at Brant Street is the only monthly continuous intake program in the TDSB where students earn a range of compulsory and elective Grade 9 and 10 credits through an exploration of the visual/performing arts and social justice issues. The schedule is a combination of guided independent study through individualized workplans and rotating monthly hands-on group classes. There are no additional portfolio or audition requirements other than a willingness to participate.

**Scadding Court Program:** The Scadding Court Program of Oasis Alternative S.S. is a stand-alone classroom located at Scadding Court Community Centre. The weekly timetable of Grade 9/10 courses is a combination of guided independent study through individualized workplans and group classes. Scadding Court Program includes a cooperative education component for qualifying students interested in working in the community.

**Triangle Program:** The Triangle Program is Canada's only Grade 9 to 12 continuous intake high school program for LGBTQ youth. It is a safer space, free from homophobia, transphobia and heterosexism where queer youth can be themselves, be respected, and valued for who they are. The Triangle Program is a classroom that supports students to develop or rediscover the skills necessary to successfully transition back to mainstream secondary school programs, post-secondary education, or to the workplace.
