Student-Vehicle Collision Data and Response Protocol in School Zones

The Board decided:

Whereas, all students have the right to safety on the streets and roads in the vicinity of Toronto schools, so that they can travel actively to school and back; and

Whereas, the City of Toronto has identified that a child is killed or seriously injured on the way to or from school every 17 weeks in the City of Toronto*; and

Whereas, research by Dr. Linda Rothman and her colleagues at the Hospital for Sick Children** has shown that schools in lower-income communities in Toronto have higher rates of child-pedestrian motor vehicle collisions, making road safety an equity issue; and

Whereas, the City of Toronto in its Vision Zero Road Safety Plan* has made the commitment that schools within a one kilometre radius of a killed or serious injury collision involving a school child will be prioritized for an in-depth review to see if there are opportunities for safety improvements in the built environment both within the school zones and along pre-designated active and safe routes to school*; and

Whereas, the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) at present does not collect statistics related to road safety involving its students who travel to school and back, nor does it have established protocols to work with the City's Transportation Department in exchanging information in the aftermath of a serious collision involving children and youth travelling to or from TDSB schools;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Director present a report to the Program and School Services Committee on May 2, 2018 on the following:

- (i) the development of a central data repository whereby the Board is able to centrally track statistics related to collisions involving its students while travelling to school and back,
- (ii) the development of a protocol to work with the City of Toronto, Toronto Police Services and other community partners in the aftermath of a serious traffic incident involving harm to a TDSB student travelling to school and back, in order to learn the details of the incident and contribute to creating a plan led by the City of Toronto, in keeping with Vision Zero guidelines, to reduce the risk of future serious injuries to students;
- (iii) an annual report to the Board on statistics with regard to the road safety of Toronto District School Board students travelling to and from school;
- (iv) the presentation of an interim report to the Board by no later than October 2018 on the progress of the initiative.
