Whereas SEAC has received nominations from the executive officer of Autism Ontario for Julie Diamond to become the Alternate Representative, and

Whereas the named applicant meets the Ministry of Education and board criteria for eligibility, therefore,

Therefore, be it resolved that the board appoint Julie Diamond as the Alternate Representative for Autism Ontario for the remainder of the 2018 to 2022 term.
