Extended and French Immersion Programs

In French Immersion, students will receive their certificate if they complete 10 courses in French. An Honours certificate for 11 courses. In Extended French, students will be awarded their certificate if they complete 7 courses. An Honours certificate for 8 courses. Exchange programs allow students to further immerse themselves in the French language and culture.
