5.	Reports from EYAC Working Groups	<u>Best Practices in Shared Space Work Group- Website:</u> The working group has recommended that staff consider actions and processes to create a greater understanding of child cares in schools and specifically shared space classrooms. Staff are in the process of developing a Principals’ webpage, which will be posted shortly. This webpage will provide a platform to support Principals in better understanding the role of child cares in school, and continue to build	

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		<p>on the relationships developed thus far. In addition, staff have been collecting submissions for a Visual Resource Library, which is intended to showcase evidence of quality programming in shared space, and will be posted on the Principals' and public webpage.</p> <p><i>Early Years School Team Professional Learning:</i> There was a discussion about the need to resume joint professional learning among early years educators in the sector. Staff will host a pilot professional learning session for 20 Early Years school teams, which will include a Principal, Teacher, Designated Early Childhood Educator, and Child Care Staff. This half day learning opportunity will be facilitated by Christina Moore from Ontario Institute for Studies in Education and will focus on supporting the ongoing development of Teacher and Early Childhood Educator relationships.</p>	
		<p><u>Facilities Work Group-</u></p> <p><i>Recommendation:</i> The work group brought forward a recommendation to review policies around providing internet access to child care operators in schools. It was noted that third party operators require access to the internet in all of their licensed rooms to meet the various ministry and city requirements.</p> <p>Rationale Presented:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Many schools have WiFi access currently - Third-party BASP operators provide care on behalf of TDSB and operate in shared space where staff cannot access the internet to communicate with families and supervisors - Operators recognize there may be a cost to access TDSB internet - Access to other TDSB services or information on the website is not being requested - Some exclusive lease spaces for 0-4 programs cannot access the internet in all of their rooms 	<p>Motion: “EYAC recommends that the TDSB provide Internet and Wi-Fi access for child care operators with lease agreements in TDSB schools in order to support quality programming, safety, efficiencies and communications with families as set out by the Ministry of Education and the City of Toronto.”</p>
