Hybrid & Remote Full Credit Summer School:
The TDSB - Continuing Education Department is offering a Summer Full Credit Program. Credit courses are open to all high school students and adults 21 years of age and older working towards their high school diploma.

The Summer Credit Program allows students with current pre-requisites earned in Ontario to enroll in one full-credit course. Full credit courses will be offered to students wishing to take a course for the first time or those who wish to retake the full course.

In our Remote Learning model students will be at home learning live with their teacher daily from 9:00 a.m. to 12:45 p.m and again from 2:00 p.m.- 3:15 p.m. Students can receive extra help daily from 1:30 p.m.- 2:00 p.m. [Remote Learning Model](#)

In our Hybrid Learning model students will be following a three(3) day rotating schedule including in person, synchronous and asynchronous learning. [Hybrid Learning Model](#)

e-Summer School

The TDSB e-Learning department is once again offering the e-Summer Credit Program. The program will be delivered entirely online. There are two sessions: July 5 to July 29, and August 3 to 27. Mandatory orientation takes place for one hour in the week before the course begins. This program services secondary school students aged 14-20 years old.

Our program offers a variety of Grade 11 and 12 full credit courses as well as Grade 10 Civics and Career Studies. Students may take the equivalent of a one-credit course in each session.

To enrol, students must have the prerequisite, register through e-Reg, and be approved by their school guidance counsellor.

This year e-Summer will also offer one reach ahead course, GLD2OE, for Grade 8 students entering Grade 9 in September 2021.

Credits earned through e-Summer will also count towards the two mandatory e-Learning credits required by students who entered Grade 9 in 2020 or later.

Attendance: Students are expected to log into Brightspace everyday and should plan to commit about six hours daily to their course. Some class time will be synchronous and some will be asynchronous.

Students who do not log in within the first week may be removed from the course.
