

Tru first made headlines at the age of 10 when she filed a human rights complaint against her Catholic school for not supporting her gender transition in school. After two years of mediation, her complaint resulted in the development of the first policy in a Catholic school in North America that supported a child's transition in school.

Since then, Tru has become a proud and voracious speaker for trans rights, and in 2015 was recognized by Vancouver Magazine as one of the city's 50 most powerful and influential people. In 2016 she was named Options for Sexual Health's Sexual Health Champion, and in 2017 her entire family was nominated to be grand marshals in the Vancouver Pride Parade. Tru was also chosen to be a speaker at Vancouver's 2017 TEDxEastVan event.

Now, at the age of 18, Tru continues to share her story to educate and inspire others and show support for members of society who feel excluded... for any reason. Tru is currently an ambassador for Out in Schools, Big Love Ball, and is a champion with the GenderCool Campaign in the U.S.

The Toronto Kiki Ballroom Alliance is a for-youth-by-youth grassroots organization that started out of the need to bring Ballroom Arts and a sense of community into the City of Toronto. Founded in 2010 in Toronto by Twysted Miyake-Mugler and, Legendary Motha Vixen in 2010; as a space to nurture the needs of Black and other radicalized LGBTQI+ youth facing various barriers and trauma.
