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	<p>➤ What other boards have done similar changes? <i>Toronto Catholic, Peel, Hamilton and Ottawa Boards have done the changes in the past.</i></p> <p>➤ What is the system approach on the communications to vendors and school councils regarding the implications on the before and after care? <i>Management and Early year's team and transportation team are working with the child care providers were fully aware of the changes and are working on the challenges.</i></p> <p>➤ Was the consideration done for FI students who get bussed from childcare in their home school to FI schools? <i>Changes of the demographics can't be predicted but the Board is working on the challenges and synchronize the program.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PIAC members expressed equity concerns and the impact on families across the Board due to the transportation changes. • Parents with precarious employment may find it challenging to avail work accommodation. <p>➤ Are there opportunities for Teachers to come early than 15 minutes to bell start for</p>
