The live sessions are not available to communities, the link can be accessed at the later part of the day by communities.</p>		

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	<p>Physical education for students</p> <p>Staff are committed and working on providing physical education in virtual schools. Staff must take into consideration safety and liability. Several online resources are available for physical activities, the activities may look different from school to school, from home to home in terms of the space allotment and engagement.</p> <p>Switching models</p> <p>A working group of staff is looking at the possibilities and proposed models for the switching models.
