About PIAC

Education is a partnership involving students, parents, teachers, principals, staff, trustees, school boards, government, and the community. The Parent Involvement Advisory Committee (PIAC) is committed to strengthening this partnership and is committed to assisting parents, and school councils.

Vision

Supporting parents as partners in education.

Mission

To aid access to information and resources for parents, especially that of the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) and Ontario Ministry of Education, in support of more effective parent engagement in their child's learning to improve student achievement and well-being, and enhance accountability of the education system.

Membership

PIAC Members are elected parent volunteers who form an Advisory Committee of the TDSB. Each TDSB Ward has two PIAC Members, a Representative and an Alternate. A current list of PIAC members can be found here. Ward Representatives and Alternates are advocate who

- provide information and advice on parent engagement to the TDSB;
- communicate with and support school councils of schools; and
- undertake activities to help parents of pupils of the board support their children's learning at home and at school.

Historical Perspective

In 2010, Parent Involvement Committees (PICs) within school boards such as the TDSB were formally established under the Ontario Education Act R.S.O 1990 "to support, encourage and enhance parent engagement in order to improve student achievement and well-being" [R.330/10, s.27 (1)]. Ontario Regulation 612/00outlines how PICs are to be structured and operated.

Governance

PIAC is governed by a series of bylaws based on guidelines set out in the Ontario Education <u>Act R.S.O 1990</u>, <u>Regulation 612/00</u>.

Member Roles and Responsibilities

PIAC's mission as described above is fulfilled through the following roles and responsibilities:

- Acquire the skills and knowledge needed to fulfill PIAC's mission;
- Communicate information from the Ontario Ministry of Education and/or the TDSB, to school councils and parents of TDSB students;
- Share best practices with school councils and support partnerships between school councils to share effective practices with each other;
- Identify and reduce barriers to parent engagement;
- Develop strategies and initiatives that effectively communicate and engage parents in improving student achievement and well-being; and
- Recommend how funding for parent involvement, provided under the Education Act as described in Ontario Education Act R.S.O 1990, Regulation 612/00, is to be used.

PIAC sent a letter to the Minister of Education in December 2024 requesting to have the school council handbook updated to reflect the current needs and landscape school councils are engaging in at this time.

Motions Passed by PIAC and Recommendations made to the Board and to Staff of the Toronto District Board of Education in the 2023/2024 school year

Whereas, pursuant to the Education Act, Ontario Regulation 612/00 (O. Reg. 612/00), "The purpose of a parent involvement committee is to support, encourage and enhance parent engagement at the

board level in order to improve student achievement and well-being. O. Reg. 330/10, s. 6." By supporting school councils of the schools of the board;

Whereas, pursuant to O. Reg. 612/00, "The purpose of school councils is, through the active participation of parents, to improve pupil achievement and to enhance the accountability of the education system to parents. O. Reg. 612/00, s. 2 (1);

Whereas the TDSB requires Principals to consult with School Councils on the school budget; Whereas School Generated Funds (SGF) are not clearly defined by TDSB as including both School Council raised funds (non-board SGF) and school staff raised funds (non-board SGF), the latter of which are not tracked by TDSB, resulting in a lack of accountability;

Whereas School Councils have protocols around financial reporting and those councils who use School CashOnline are reliant on office staff to provide the necessary School CashOnline report data;

Whereas Model Schools for Inner Cities funding allocation is part of the school budget but is not clearly communicated with School Councils;

Whereas school Nutrition Programs are school partners and often receive fundraised money from the parent/caregiver community and these programs' financial records should be shared with School Council for greater transparency;

Whereas School Councils receive annual Operational Funds for council administration (\$1.25 per

pupil: min. \$300 - max. \$1000) and for Parent Engagement (\$500 per school), found on GL 41500 of the school budget that many schools are unaware of, the spending of which is a School Council decision in consultation with the Principal;

Whereas there is a need for transparency and accountability of school funds, for system accountability;

Therefore, be it resolved that PIAC recommends that:

- 1. The Director provide a report on School Generated Funds (non-board funds) of schools which includes:
- a. non-board funds raised by School Councils; and
- b. non-board funds raised by the schools (not including funds raised by School Councils)
- 2. PIAC be provided with a definition and the reporting criteria of School Generated Funds (non-board) that specifies:
- a. School Councils' fundraising (non-board funds), and
- b. schools' fundraising (non-board funds)
- 3. Principals regularly report to their School Councils on the school's fundraising of non-board funds.
- 4. Principals regularly report to their School Councils on the school's budget, including, but not limited to, Model School funding and school Nutrition Program funding.

- 5. That each fall information and training regarding the reporting of school budgets, including all fundraising of non-board funds be provided to:
- a. Principals,
- b. Office Administrators, and
- c. School Councils/treasurer role and function
