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	<p data-bbox="574 260 1279 291"><u>Update from Ron Felsen on Secondary School Review (SSR)</u></p> <p data-bbox="574 317 1292 386"><i>As discussed with Kate Leuschen Millar, Co-lead by phone on November 10th.</i></p> <p data-bbox="574 417 1409 869">The SSR is a review, and as such it asked for feedback but was not under consultations in the same way as a policy. It is being given to the Trustees this week, recommending the Trustees go into phase 1, the planning process to determine basic re-org of schools to level attendance numbers and programs to increase equity of access. It does not include the associated Specialized Schools and Programs Policy or Optional Attendance Policy. The next phase for engagement on the SSR would be at the individual school level when determining closure, consolidation, etc. Technically, the Optional Attendance Policy is complete. But it was severed from the original Specialized Schools and Programs Policy so it will wait for submission to Trustees as a pair. [see Update from Vitaly Plotnikov]</p> <p data-bbox="574 953 1341 1022"><u>Update on policy consultations from Vitaly Plotnikov, Policy Coordinator</u></p> <p data-bbox="574 1050 1289 1081"><i>As sent by email on November 9<sup>th</sup> to Michelle Munroe, PCEO</i></p> <p data-bbox="574 1119 1409 1365">“At the last GPC meeting trustees recommended that staff should complete public consultations on policies that essentially were at the final stages of consultations prior to the shut down in March. These policies, posted on the Policy Consultations webpage, are the Records and Information Management Policy and the Advertising and Distribution of Materials Policy. For all other polices, staff made a commitment to devise a process for virtual policy consultations.</p> <p data-bbox="574 1404 1403 1755">I’ve spoken with Manon this morning and we are planning to update our Policy Consultation webpage and advise the public and the stakeholders that the feedback on the two policies can be provided until December 31, 2020 (this date is to be confirmed with Executive owners). In early 2021, we hope to have a process developed for virtual policy consultations on other current/upcoming policies, particularly those that would require broad, town-hall type public engagement. This process could be applied to the Specialized Schools and Programs Policy and I assume to the Parent and Community Involvement Policy.”</p>
