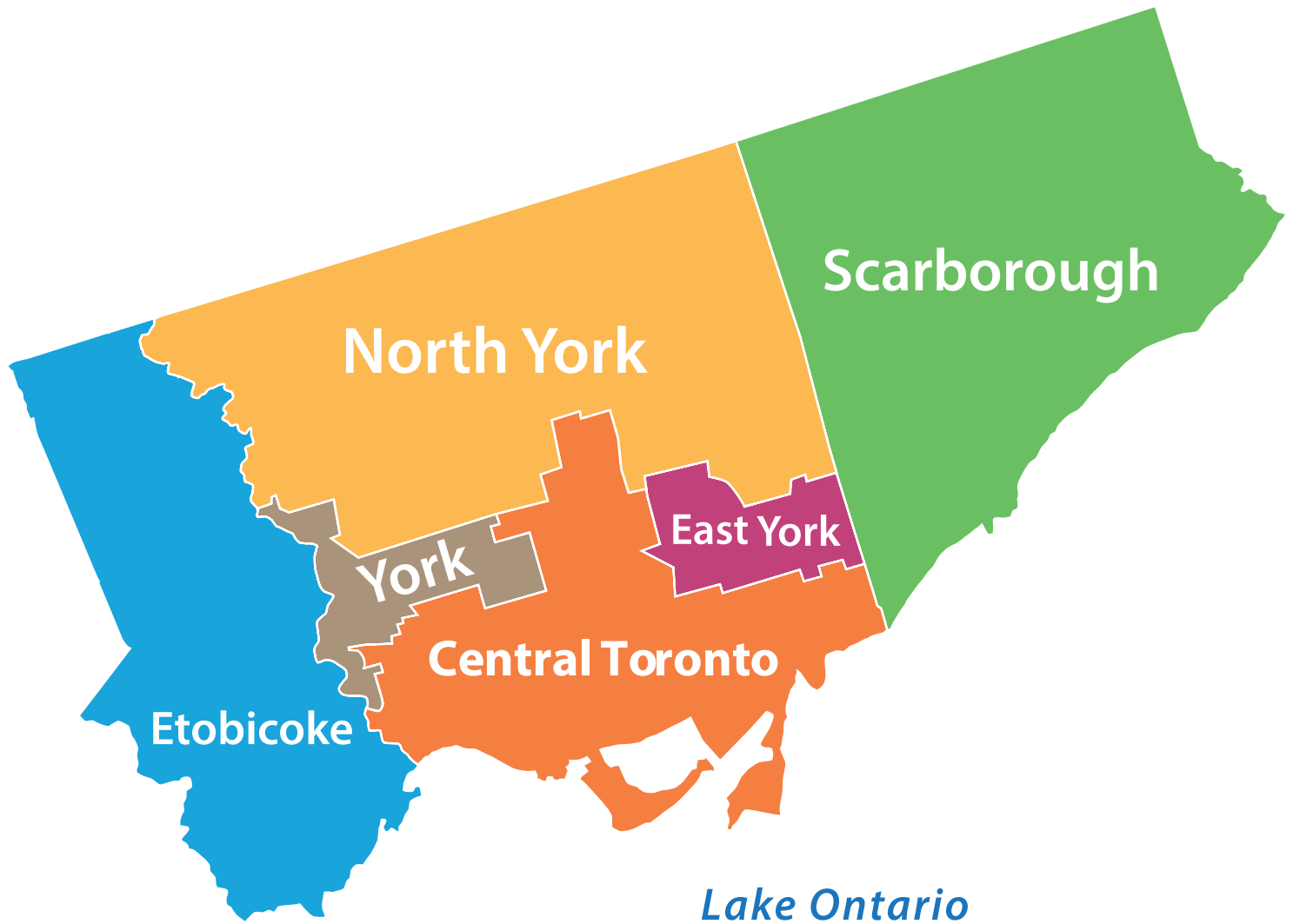
MAP OF CANADA

Placement of elementary students is based on the residential address of the parent or legal guardian.

For international students, beginning their education in the elementary years offers a distinct advantage. Early immersion in an English-speaking environment accelerates language development, builds academic confidence, and supports smooth cultural integration. Dedicated English Language Learner (ELL) support ensures students are well supported from their first day and throughout their learning journey.

Extensive Access to Specialized Secondary Programs

Starting early also allows students to become familiar with the Canadian education system and to seamlessly access the full range of specialized secondary programs, including arts, STEM, and other enriched pathways upon completing Grade 8.

Seamless Transition to Secondary School

With a strong emphasis on continuity and community, TDSB ensures a smooth transition from Grade 8 to secondary school and a clear pathway to the local secondary school, subject to TDSB placement requirements, helping students move forward with confidence. For example, international students enrolled in Grade 8 at Highland Middle School or Zion Heights Middle School whose legal guardian or custodian resides within the attendance boundary of A. Y. Jackson Secondary School will be guaranteed placement at A. Y. Jackson Secondary School for Grade 9.

PATHWAYS TO SECONDARY



SECONDARY PROGRAM (GRADES 9 TO 12)

TDSB offers internationally recognized high school education with a focus on preparing students for post-secondary education and career success. Our 110 secondary schools offer a wide range of academic, language, and elective courses, including Advanced Placement (AP) programs, arts, and extracurricular activities to meet the interests and goals of every student.

✓ **SHSM**

The Specialist High Skills Major programs offer students opportunities to complete the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) while focusing on a specific economic sector and supporting transitions to college, apprenticeship, university and the workplace. 16 economic sectors are represented and all boards must have Ministry approval in order to offer a SHSM.

✓ **Specialized Programs**

The TDSB offers Specialized Programs that are focused on the Arts, Math, Science & Technology, Leadership and more! All students meeting the eligibility requirements with an interest in the program focus are invited to apply.

✓ **AP**

The Advanced Placement Program (AP) is a cooperative agreement between participating secondary schools and post-secondary institutions. AP courses permit you to undertake additional academic content as identified by postsecondary institutions.

✓ **IB**

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program is a demanding two-year pre-university course of study designed for highly motivated secondary school students. The IB Program at the TDSB is a Specialized Program to which students can apply.

✓ **Co-op**

Co-operative education involves partnership between education and business, industry, the trades and professional organizations with the purpose of extending learning opportunities beyond the traditional classroom. Co-op offers students an opportunity to earn high school credits through a course that integrates classroom theory with learning experiences in a workplace. Students apply and further develop skills related to a high school course and career area of choice.

HOMESTAY & OUR COMMUNITIES

International students enrolled in the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) have the option to live with their parents in Toronto or with Canadian host families who provide support and care during their studies.

Living with a Canadian family offers an exceptional opportunity for students to enhance their cross-cultural communication skills, both at school and in global settings. To meet students' accommodation needs, the TDSB collaborates with leading homestay service organizations in Canada. All host families are carefully vetted through a thorough due diligence process, which includes interviews, reference checks, and criminal record checks. The selection process also involves careful matching based on the preferences and requests of both the student and the host family. Each placement is confirmed in writing, accompanied by a family profile, photographs, and a location map.

Students under the age of 18 are required to have a custodian residing in the Greater Toronto Area and are not permitted to live on their own. Those aged 18 and above have the option to live independently or with host families.

For younger students in Grade 8 and below, it is mandatory to reside with their parents or custodians.

Study Permit

Student receives Conditional Offer of Acceptance and pays fees within two weeks.

STEP 3

Reporting

Student receives Official Letter of Acceptance and applies for visa/Study Permit through Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC)

STEP 4

First Day at School

Student reports to TDSB at required time.

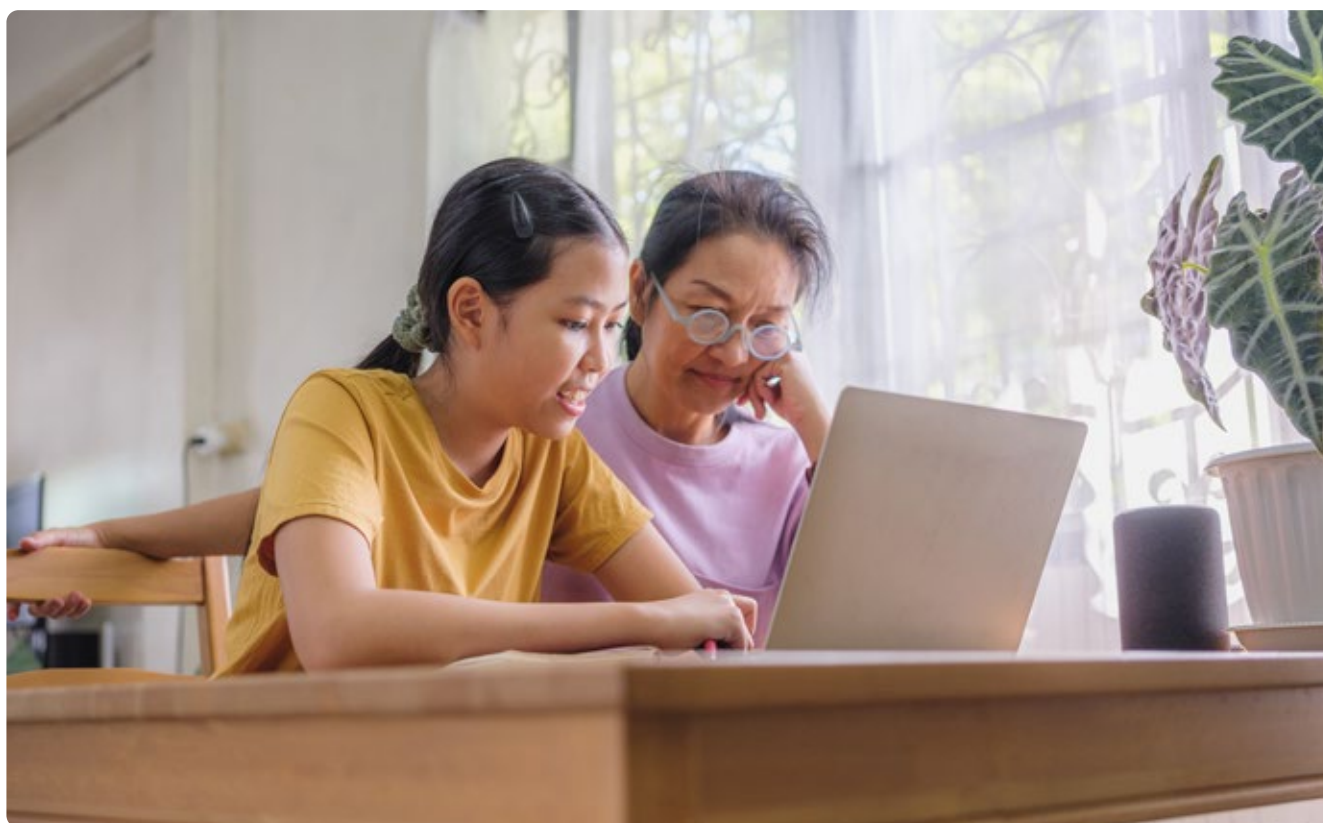
