Weaving Our Legacies: Returning to Our Collective Path Enlazar Nuestres Legados: Volver a Nuestre Camino Colectivo

April 2024: Poster Showcase

The month of April is recognized as Latin–America History Month at the Toronto District School Board. An invitation is being extended to all TDSB students to submit a Poster that reflects on this year's upcoming theme of *Weaving Our Legacies: Returning to Our Collective Path* | *Enlazar Nuestres Legados: Volver a Nuestre Camino Colectivo.*

The "e" in *Nuestres* was purposefully chosen to disrupt the dominant and default patriarchal binary gender grammar system of the colonial language of Spanish. The intentional use of the letter "e" as gender inclusive was created by LGBTQIA+, gender non-binary, and feminist communities in what is recognized today as Latin-America.

Poster Showcase Guidelines

All entries will be evaluated based on originality, interpretation and connection that best captures (Decolonizing) Latin-America History Month and beyond, the focus and theme of 2024: "Weaving Our Legacies: Return to Our Collective Path | Enlazar Nuestres Legados: Volver a Nuestre Camino Colectivo." Weaving individual and collective legacies of resistance, struggles, joy, love, and healing as peoples of the Latin-America / Abya Yala diaspora; alongside a communal purpose of raising consciousness moving towards reclaiming our whole authentic selves and a (re)commitment to reciprocal relations, solidarity and action towards a just world.

Requirements to Enter the Poster Showcase

- All electronic copies must be printable on 8-½ x 11 (letter size) paper. (Note: Only electronic copies will be accepted. *Kindly photograph your poster and email the picture to the email addresses provided below.*
- Each entry must contain the following details:
 - Title of the entry
 - A sentence about the image they have created
 - Full name(s) of the student(s) (include all names for group entries)
 - Age and grade of the student(s)

- School name attended by the student(s)
- Contact phone number and email address of the teacher responsible for the entry, especially if the student(s) cannot provide their TDSB email address.
- Filled out the TDSB <u>Student Media Release Consent Form</u> (Form 529B) so that submissions may potentially be shared on the TDSB website and LAHM social media (Twitter and Instagram)
