II. Ontario Secondary School Literacy Requirement

- The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) is a computer-based test that measures whether students are meeting the minimum standard for literacy across all subjects up to the end of Gr. 9.
- Students write the OSSLT, in their Gr. 10 year (or higher),
 - *except ESL A, B, C and D are normally “deferred” to write OSSLT in a later year to have more time to gain academic language proficiency across curriculum.*
- Successful score is 70% (Level 3, or OSSLT scoreband of 300)
- If unsuccessful, students may attempt the OSSLT test the next school year, or may enrol in the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OLC40).

III. 40 Community Service Hours

- Purpose: to deepen an awareness for civic responsibility
- Gain new skills and connect to community
- Must be on the approved activity list (pg. 2 of form)
- Form or Letter to be completed by organization
- Submit form/letter to school's guidance department (or per school process), to be recorded in school system.
- For each semester or school year you were PLE'd for credits, you will also be PLE's for community service hours
 - ie. if you gained 8 PLE credits for grade 9, you will also be awarded 10 volunteer hours. [Community Service Form](#)

IV. Online Learning Requirement

- New graduation requirement for secondary students
- Complete two e-Learning credits
- Promotes digital literacy and skills to support learning for success after graduating.
 - E-learning credits at TDSB are offered through night school and summer school at an additional cost to International Students (\$1500/course)
- If students do not have the opportunity to take an e-learning course, they may withdraw/opt out of this new requirement by completing the “opt out” form through school guidance dept.

ATTENDANCE

Students **must** be in school everyday | ABSENCES MUST BE REPORTED TO SCHOOL BY CUSTODIAN

- Absences - **CUSTODIAN OR PARENT** must verify with an email or call school before 9:00am and upon the student's return
- **Unexplained Absence** = phone call home by school
- **15 consecutive absences** = can be demitted from school
- **Chronic/multiple unexplained absences** = can be demitted/denied renewal
- **Planned absence** = notify your school, teachers, counsellors *form
- Students leaving during the day MUST sign out in the main office with custodian/parental permission
- See Student Handbook for more information

IRCC CUSTODIAN RESPONSIBILITIES

- You are the **LEGAL** adult responsible for student
- You must be available for contact by school, student and homestay
- Regular and ongoing communication regarding student progress
 - Newsletters, emails, fact sheets, phone calls, letters
- **Support - student and school**
 - Ensure that the student is attending all classes
 - Attend parent-interviews, school presentations, concerts
 - Help student prepare for school (sleep, nutrition)
 - Communicate with parents regularly
 - Escort student to any appointments - medical
 - Monitor student's progress, check-ins about homework, tests etc.
 - You may request a meeting with the teacher at any time during the year
 - Make sure that your students renew and make payments on time

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MEDICAL CONCERNS AND SCHOOL

- **Toronto Public Health Resources/Information:**

- **Immunization and up-to-date records**
 - must be up to date and complete
 - measles, chickenpox, lice must be reported to the School office
 - fax immunization records to TPH (does not need to be translated)
- **In case of Emergency (9-1-1)**
 - maintain correct address & phone# (custodian / home) with school
 - provide additional emergency contact (name, number, email)
 - provide special medical history / medication details
- **Long Term Illness, Allergies, and Medication**
 - Refrain from bringing peanut products to school and heavy fragrance
 - Inform main office if you carry an EpiPen®
 - provide medical documentation (doctor's note) for illness more than 5 days



REPORTING IMMUNIZATION

- Ontario requires that students be vaccinated against nine designated diseases or have a valid exemption: **Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Diphtheria, Tetanus, Polio, Meningococcal, Pertussis (whooping cough), Varicella (chickenpox)** – only applies to students born on or after 2010
- International students (16+) and/or the legal custodian must submit immunization records to Toronto Public Health (TPH) by regular mail, fax or email immunization@toronto.ca
- Immunization records do NOT need to be translated
- **TPH will review immunization documents and notify by letter if information or vaccines are missing**
- The letter will include instructions for “next steps”, and TPH contact information
- **If students do not comply with TPH about vaccine information in the timeframe provided, the Medical Officer of Health will issue suspension orders to the schools’ principal**
