1. an example of food packaging that can be recycled
2. a lunch item that can only be put in the garbage
3. an item added to Toronto’s list of recyclable items in December 2008
4. an item that will help make your lunch waste free
5. an item that you must separate into two parts – one part is garbage and one part is recyclable
6. an example of recyclable paper
7. an item that can be recycled at a hazardous waste depot or taken to an Environment Day
8. an item that can be donated to a charity
9. an item that can go in a backyard composter
10. an item you may find during your locker cleanout that could be reused instead of being thrown in the garbage
11. a beverage container that CANNOT be recycled in Toronto
12. a beverage container that CAN be recycled in Toronto
13. always bring one of these items when shopping
14. an item that can go into the green bin but not a backyard composter
15. a symbol where the arrows represent the 3 states of matter
