

Trustee Update: Ward 10 Trustee [Chris Moise](#)

- Happenings in Ward 10;
 - 80000 students now in virtual school
 - There was a reorganization in October and staffing was adjusted, every student now has a teacher.
 - There will not be further reorganization until the new year.
 - French reorganization took place in November. There continues to be a shortage of french teachers and [recruitment](#) is ongoing
 - TDSB [Director of Education search](#) continues

- Statistics are showing that many of the families choosing virtual school are actually from marginalized areas of the city. We need to work as a community to make sure that the issues in the system are addressed holistically and support is given to in class and virtual school students.

 - Expanded COVID-19 testing is being led by [Toronto Public Health \(TPH\)](#) We take our direction on cohorts isolating etc.. from TPH. As we get information on which schools will be getting mass testing, we will update the community

Staying Well During COVID

- Q&A
 - It was stated that many of the Virtual School families are marginalised, do we know why?
 - [Chris Moise](#): Parts of our city are over represented. The stats say the Virtual School population is 50/50 but broken down by neighbourhood it is a different story.
 - [Sandy Spyropoulos](#): [Learning Centre 4 \(LC4\)](#) has the lowest number of virtual school students in the Board which speaks to the demographics. Lower income neighbourhoods are experiencing higher instances of COVID-19, these families live in close quarters and often have multigenerational households which causes students to stay home in virtual school. Many also live in apartment buildings and are worried about moving through common spaces like elevators etc...
 - How can we fundraise for Virtual Schools?
 - D. Williams: PIAC held a focus group with virtual school parents and fundraising didn't come out as a high priority. Communication and responsiveness were at the top of the list. PIAC will be having more focus groups and roundtable s going forward.
 - What planning is in place to reintegrate the virtual school students into in-person learning?
 - [Sandy Spyropoulos](#) : Our focus has been and continues to be our readiness to pivot into fully remote learning for the entire Board if need be given the growing numbers of COVID-19 cases. Maybe once there is a vaccine we will shift our focus to the return to bricks and mortar.
 - Steve Yee, Principal at Harbord CI: We are much better equipped right now to pivot to remote learning then we were in March. Because of virtual school, we have many more resources etc.. We are not perfect but we are far more ready to serve our students virtually when and if it is needed.

- [Chris Moise](#) : Secondary students are already in a hybrid format so the pivot will be more seamless for them. It is the elementary schools where there are still things to work out. Technology for example. We sent a lot of technology home with students in March and it has remained there. We are (as I stated in my update) working to get technology back into the schools. This is ongoing and it is a funding issue as well.
- [Mike Gallagher](#) : There has been a strange benefit to having to send cohorts of students home to self isolate. It has allowed teachers to trial run their virtual classrooms. And, because of virtual school being in place we have much more collective professional knowledge to share.
