





Guide to Community Resources

This guide has been created to provide students, parents/guardians, community members and staff with a list of resources and agencies that address the social determinants of health. The World Health Organization defines social determinants of health as the conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work and age. These conditions have a direct impact on health and can result in health inequities.

The Toronto District School Board's Model Schools for Inner Cities Program is committed to ensuring that every student succeeds. Not every family or community has access to the same opportunities and social supports. Challenges like poverty and language barriers can affect how well students do in school. Model Schools for Inner Cities ensures students in the inner city grow up with all the positive choices and opportunities they need to thrive.

The community resources and agencies listed in this guide provide support services for students, families and communities in Toronto. They have been separated into five categories: Health and Wellness, Housing, Education, Financial Support and New to Canada. Each section contains a list of tools, resources and opportunities that work to create equity in our communities.

How does **Model Schools for Inner Cities** work?

Over 150 schools in the MSIC Program are divided into seven Clusters across the city. Each Cluster receives support in the form of staff and resources to carry out the program's Five Essential Components. Cluster committees support the program initiatives and cluster-specific needs. Cluster committees are comprised of Superintendents, Principals, Lead Teachers, Teaching Learning Coaches, Learning Classroom Teachers and Community Support Workers. This group meets regularly to share best practices and learn from each other.

The Five Essential Components of a Model School:

1. Innovation in teaching and learning practice and in school structure
2. Support services to meet social, emotional and physical well-being of students
3. School as the heart of the community
4. Research, review and evaluation of students and programs
5. Commitment to share successful practices

Supporting our School Communities

In 2006, the MSIC Program was launched with three schools. The following year, the program expanded to include four more schools. Currently, over 150 of 588 schools in the TDSB are part of the MSIC Program. The Learning Opportunities Index measures the level of external barriers to student success. The schools in the MSIC Program are among those requiring the most support to close the opportunity gap to achieve equitable outcomes for all. The Goals of Model Schools for Inner Cities

1. Equity: Achieving fairness and equity to ensure the lives and realities of our students are reflected and affirmed. Closing the opportunity gap to support equitable outcomes for all students.

2. Community: Equitable educational opportunities and adequate school resources allow schools to become the heart of their communities and the pillars of their neighbourhoods.

3. Inclusiveness: An inclusive culture that respects and reflects all aspects of the school, its community, students and staff.

4. Expectations: Achievement enhances self-esteem, which in turn fuels achievement. Every child is expected to progress to the highest level of which they are capable, regardless of economic or cultural background.
