

Virtual Field Trips and Special Assemblies

Recently, a number of Grade 3 and 6 teachers have engaged in a series of professional learning opportunities. Students also participated in synchronous interactive virtual assemblies and field trips. During these exciting weeks, over 3,000 students and 160 teachers benefited from this program.



The Grade 3 virtual assemblies included creative arts sessions and fundamental movements sessions to learn the importance of being physically active during these challenging times.

The Grade 6 virtual trips involved outdoor trips to the Scarborough Outdoor Education School with a focus on biodiversity.

Students have been actively engaged in learning while teachers connected with one another to learn and gain new skills.
