To share information on the next steps in the process.




Context and Background – Legacy Boundaries

- Technical and commercial boundaries were created when students were streamed into a particular type of school.
- The practice of streaming no longer exists; technical and commercial boundaries have outlived their intended purpose.
- Former technical and commercial schools have reinvented themselves over time, and now offer composite/academic programs and pathways, much like other collegiates across the city.
- Technical and commercial boundaries established by legacy school boards still exist, offering additional choices to some.
- Space pressures due to large regional access.



Context and Background – Secondary Boundaries


 Admission to secondary schools within the Toronto District School Board is administered through a series of <u>collegiate</u> attendance areas.





Context and Background – Commercial Boundaries


• A large layer of boundaries also exists that provides students with access to a former commercial school.





Context and Background – Technical Boundaries

 Another, even larger layer of boundaries exists that provides students with access to a former technical school.



 - Collegiate boundary, small Technical boundary







Context and Background – The Geographic Challenge

- Former technical and commercial schools are already situated within a collegiate boundary, and are also located very close to adjacent collegiates.
- This proximity doesn't allow for a separate collegiate boundary to be created for the former technical and commercial schools.

Proposal - Overview

Secondary Schools without a Boundary

- Distinct application (not Out-of-Area process)
- Regular program open to all students residing in the City of Toronto
- No boundaries; no 'as-of-right' access

Central Technical School

Central Toronto Academy

Danforth C & TI

Western Technical Commercial School

Local Collegiates

- Will admit students to the regular program through the collegiate boundary only
- Subject to space, students residing outside of the collegiate boundary may apply through the Out-of-Area Admissions process


Proposal - Overview

- Students accepted would have the opportunity to take advantage of the technical offerings in addition to all courses offered at the school.
- The proposed changes impact admission to the <u>regular</u> <u>program only</u> (does not impact Gifted programs or Central Student Interest Programs).
- Dissolve all legacy technical and commercial boundaries for admission in <u>September 2025</u>. Students currently registered at these schools would not be impacted.
- All affected areas would continue to have a designated collegiate as per the boundary.



Proposal – Street Guide Modification

If approved - What all addresses in the city would see




A floating and frozen banner would be introduced at the top of the Find Your School address search results that identifies the four schools.

The columns technical programming and commercial school would be removed from the table.



^{*}Students have the option of attending the listed schools. Once you have been admitted to an **elementary school**, you are expected to attend that school until graduation <u>as long as</u> you continue to live in the school's attendance area. Once you have been admitted to a **secondary school**, you are expected to attend that school until graduation. If you wish to attend the other listed school(s), you will have to apply through <u>Out-of-Area Admissions</u>.

Benefits to Schools and System

- Pre-set enrolment targets to mitigate overcrowding and eliminate the unpredictability of having large regional boundaries.
- Positive impact on students: consistent enrolment leads to consistent staffing which leads to consistent timetables for students.
- Single set of attendance boundaries for all addresses.
- Improves equity of access by extending an opportunity for all students to apply and attend.
- Addresses public perception of 'tech' schools.
- Creates an opportunity to further explore how these schools can better meet the needs of our system



Feedback We've Heard So Far

- If the legacy boundaries are dissolved:
 - Priority access should be given to siblings of current students
 - Priority access should be given to addresses within current legacy boundaries
 - Priority access should be given to students interested in pursuing technical programming
- Clarity on how the application process would work and if a lottery would be introduced.
- Clarity on why a separate application process is proposed (why is it different from Out-of-Area Admissions).
- Why only one option is available for the Secondary Schools Without a Boundary.
- Support for fully dissolving commercial boundaries because the program doesn't exist.
- Proposal provides more equitable access to technical programs.
- Removing guaranteed access for some creates a more equitable system for all.
