
Setting the Context: Long-Term Program and Accommodation Strategy (LTPAS)

The LTPAS provides an approach to program and accommodation planning with a ten-year timeframe that allows for responsiveness and flexibility in a ever changing environment.

The LTPAS identifies studies/ reviews that address program priorities and accommodation issues facing our schools, across the Board.

Boundary Change Study:

"Explore a boundary change between Niagara St. Jr. PS and The Waterfront School to address accommodation pressures at Niagara St. Jr. PS"






Setting the Context: Why are we here?

- Niagara St Jr PS is a JK to grade 6 school, located at 222 Niagara St (Southeast corner of Adelaide St W and Niagara St)
- Niagara St Jr PS has been consistently experiencing accommodation pressures due to enrolment growth
- Currently operating at 95% utilization rate
- Enrolment is projected to continue to grow in the long-term, resulting in classroom shortages
- Small school building; all classrooms are being utilized for instructional use
- School site is small (0.86 acres) makes the placement of portables challenging/impossible on the site.



Accommodation Solutions Applied Currently: Space Retrieval from Childcare


Retrieval of one classroom space from the Childcare for instructional use, in September 2022





Accommodation Solutions Applied Currently: Development Redirection

- 13 residential towers were temporarily redirected to Ryerson CS, made effective May 2022.
- Projected to yield approx. 50 students (JK to 6) between 2023 and 2029.
- Will continue to be redirected until a long term strategy is identified for Niagara St Jr PS
- The aim is to have these redirections brought back to their local school once enrolment has stabilized at Niagara St Jr PS.





Setting the Context: The Waterfront School


- Located at 635 Queens Quay W Southeast corner of Queens Quay W & Bathurst St

- 2023 Utilization: 79% utilization
- Programs: Regular Track only








Proposed Accommodation Solution Proposal: Boundary Change Review




Boundary change proposed to designate the **Fort York area** from the Niagara Street Junior Public

Boundary change proposed for September 2025.




Proposed Accommodation Solution Proposal: Boundary Change Review

- Fort York area: South of the Fort York Blvd, North of the Lake Shore Blvd W and West of Bathurst St.
- The Fort York area is within walking distance of The Waterfront School
- Approx. 107 TDSB students reside in the Fort York area.
- Approx. 60 of the Fort York area students attend Niagara St Jr PS across all grades.
- Approx. 15 of those 60 students are in JK.







After Boundary Change Implementation: Niagara St Jr PS

Boundary Change – Additional Details: Legacy Students & Siblings

- Students residing in the Fort York area and that are currently attending Niagara St Jr PS as of the end of June 2025, will have the choice to continue attending Niagara St Jr PS until graduation.
- Younger siblings of students currently attending Niagara St Jr PS can choose to attend Niagara with their older sibling.
- The older sibling needs to be enrolled at Niagara St Jr PS at the time the younger sibling begins school.
- Proposal to implement boundary change in September 2025 is to give parents and families sufficient time to weigh their options for the 2025-26 school year.



Boundary Change – Additional Details: Middle & Secondary School

Middle School:

- If the Boundary Change is approved, TDSB students residing in the Fort York area will attend The Waterfront School for middle school.
- Existing students currently attending Niagara St Jr PS and residing in the Fort York area as of the end of June 2025, will have the choice to attend Ryerson CS or The Waterfront School for middle School.

Secondary School:

 If the boundary change is approved, the secondary school pathway will remain at Parkdale CI.



Boundary Change – Additional Details: Early & Mid French Immersion Catchments

Early French Immersion Catchment:

- The current Early French Immersion catchment for the Fort York area is Lord Lansdowne > Harbord CI.
- The current Early French Immersion catchment for The Waterfront School is Winchester PS > Harbord CI.
 - After the implementation of the boundary change, the Early French Immersion boundary will be updated to Winchester PS > Harbord CI.

Middle French Immersion Catchment:

- The current Middle French Immersion catchment for the Fort York area and The Waterfront School is Ryerson CS > Oakwood CI.
 - After the implementation of the boundary change, the Middle French Immersion catchment will remain the same.



Timelines & Next Steps

- The Local Feasibility Team will reconvene to review and consider feedback received from this evening's meeting, e-mail and the survey.
- The Local Feasibility Team will develop a final set of recommendations and draft a report to the Board of Trustees for approval.
- The report will be presented to the Planning and Priorities Committee of the Board on April 11, 2024
- The Board of Trustees will make a final decision on April 17, 2024.
- Decisions will be communicated following the meeting.
