Context and Background – Legacy Boundaries

- Admission to secondary schools within the Toronto District School Board is administered through a series of 'collegiate' attendance areas.
- Technical and commercial boundaries established by legacy school boards still exist in certain areas, particularly the old City of Toronto.
- The network of technical and commercial boundaries that currently exist have outlived their intended purpose, which was to 'stream' students into a particular type of program.
- Former technical and commercial schools have reinvented themselves over time, and now offer academic programs and pathways, similar to other collegiates across the City.
- Some legacy boundaries have been eliminated over time as other accommodation reviews were undertaken (e.g. Business and Technical Institutes)
- Legacy boundaries do not align with the guiding principles of the LTPAS, or the goals of the Secondary Program Review.

Context and Background – Secondary Program Review


- A review of all secondary schools, programs, policies and procedures to ensure that all students have equitable access to programs and opportunities, as close to home as possible.
- Vision is a system of <u>strong neighbourhood schools</u> that provide rich programming and increased access to courses that support all pathways.
- Existing structure of secondary schools across the TDSB is not in sync with the recent strategic and visionary documents approved by the Board of Trustees.
- Unintended consequences of the existing landscape, including inequity of access and an imbalance of enrolment among secondary schools in the system.
- Emerging from the Secondary Program Review was a strong desire to review the legacy technical and commercial boundaries due to the equity challenges they present.

Context and Background – Proposal

- Dissolve the legacy boundaries and create <u>boundaryless secondary schools</u> for <u>September 2025</u> (Northern SS and Victoria Park CI would continue to operate with their existing collegiate boundaries).
- All students in the City of Toronto would have equal opportunity to apply; certain neighbourhoods would no longer have 'as-of-right' access and multiple secondary school choices.
- All addresses would still have a designated collegiate.
- Impacted schools would continue to operate as they currently do no existing programs would be impacted by this change.
- TDSB website, specifically 'Find Your School', to be enhanced to create a presence for secondary schools without a boundary.
- Centralized admission process would be created and caps set each year to support strong programming while mitigating accommodation pressures.




Context and Background – Collegiate Boundaries






Context and Background – Legacy <u>Technical</u> Boundaries



- A floating and frozen banner is introduced at the top of the Find Your School address search results that identifies the four schools.
- The columns for technical and commercial programming are removed from the table.



^{*}Students have the option of attending the listed schools. Once you have been admitted to an elementary school, you are expected to attend that school until graduation as long as you continue to live in the school's attendance area. Once you have been admitted to a secondary school, you are expected to attend that school until graduation. If you wish to attend the other listed school(s), you will have to apply through Out-of-Area Admissions.
