1. What is a Boundary Change Review?

Local neighbourhood schools have attendance areas defined by boundaries that are used to establish admission to a school's regular program. Boundaries between two schools can be changed to reduce overcrowding, utilize surplus space or designate addresses to a closer school.

A Boundary Change Review is one of the strategies included in the Board's Long-Term Program and Accommodation Strategy (LTPAS), a document that was first created in 2014 and is reviewed annually. The strategy provides an approach to program and accommodation planning within a ten-year timeframe that allows for responsiveness and flexibility in a changing environment. It is a roadmap for the future that identifies studies that could lead to Accommodation Reviews.

Yes, if you live within the split secondary attendance area of Etobicoke CI/Richview CI.



3. When will the attendance boundary changes take effect?

Subject to Board approval, the changes to the attendance area boundaries are set to take effect in **September 2026** for new Regular Program students residing at the specified addresses.

4. Do you know if this boundary change has any effect on the French Immersion program at Richview CI or Learning Disability (LD) Special Education program at Etobicoke CI?

There are currently no changes being proposed to the secondary school pathway for French Immersion or Learning Disability (LD) program students who reside or move to the addresses listed above.

5. How will the shared attendance boundary change affect my child <u>currently</u> attending Etobicoke CI?

There is no effect to students who are currently enrolled in the Regular program at Etobicoke CI. Students currently enrolled at Etobicoke CI may continue to do so until graduation.

6. I have children who are currently attending intermediate school and will be <u>starting</u> Grade 9 in September 2025. Will they be able to attend Etobicoke CI?

Yes, they will be able to register at Etobicoke CI since the boundary change will take effect in September 2026.

7. I have children currently enrolled at Etobicoke CI, as well as younger children who have not yet started Grade 9. Will the younger children be able to attend Etobicoke CI? Yes, younger siblings will be allowed to register at Etobicoke CI if they have an older sibling attending Etobicoke CI as of September 2026.

8. What other options have been put forth to help with Etobicoke Cl's accommodation pressures?

Etobicoke CI site cannot accommodate any portable classrooms.



- There is one special education program, but it serves the local community.
 Furthermore, the removal would not impact the short or long-term accommodation pressures.
- Internal retrofits to 3 classrooms will begin this summer 2025, to create additional classroom space.
- Etobicoke Cl's Out-Of-Area status is 'Closed'.
- Etobicoke CI is no longer accepting new students from the VISA program.

While Etobicoke CI is operating at or over 100% utilization, secondary class sizes are – on average – larger than elementary class sizes, so more students can be accommodated in secondary facilities without the need for additional space.

9. Etobicoke CI is still projected to be over 100% utilized in the long run. Have staff explored any long-term plans to address this?

The central Etobicoke area is experiencing ongoing residential intensification. While enrolment at Etobicoke CI is projected to remain relatively stable over the next three years—largely due to the gradual phase-out of Out-of-Area and VISA students, and the fact that many new residential developments are still in the pre-construction phase—accommodation pressures are anticipated to persist.

At the elementary level, schools in the area generally have small sites, which can quickly reach over-capacity. To address this, the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) received funding from the Government of Ontario in 2024 to construct a new elementary school at the TDSB owned 160 Silverhill Drive site. In the meantime, staff have implemented measures to manage enrolment growth until the new school is operational.

At the secondary level, Etobicoke CI has seen steady enrolment growth. This growth has been managed through efficient scheduling and use of classroom space. However, the site cannot accommodate portable classrooms, raising concerns about the school's ability to support further growth. A proposed boundary change between Etobicoke CI and Richview CI is expected to reduce some of the current accommodation pressure.

Looking ahead, there is an opportunity to address future enrolment challenges related to upcoming residential developments along Dundas Street West, Cloverdale Mall, and the Etobicoke City Centre. This could be achieved by exploring secondary boundary adjustments in alignment with the elementary boundary review associated with the new school at 160 Silverhill. Currently, secondary students living near 160 Silverhill are split between Etobicoke CI and Silverthorn CI. Establishing both an elementary and secondary attendance area could



potentially avoid a split secondary boundary for students living within the future school's attendance area.

10. Why can't the child care within Etobicoke CI just be moved out to provide more classroom space?

Child cares are a valued partner and as such they are accommodated in many TDSB schools. The mandate for child care falls under the Ministry of Education, who strongly encourage the co-location of these users within local schools. Further, the majority of child care spaces within our local schools serve the community in which they are located. There is a formal process for reclaiming child care space from operators within our schools, when this required.
