These acts are remembered in November, typically the 4th Saturday and in schools it is honoured on the Friday. For more information visit the Toronto District School Board website under “significant dates”. - Jim is aware that November is Aboriginal month and thanks to the board it has been highlighted on the TDSB website. - Jim indicated that the Digital Storytelling will be presented to the senior team on December 2nd, 2013. - For the first time there is a charter for active safe transportation on how students can be more active getting to and from school. - Full Day Kindergarten is in its last year of implementation and next year all students will have been fully integrated in the program. 	<p>January meeting.</p>

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Barbara-Ann Felschow	<p>Gave a presentation with updates of the Aboriginal Education Centre – See Appendix for John’s Power Point presentation.</p> <p>Aboriginal Secondary Pilot</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Arts and Media program is for a credit, thanks to John Chasty - Acknowledged Michelle Corneau for her workshop and read some positive testimonials from attendees - Thanked Ed for participating in the workshop on November 15th, 2013 - Distributed a flyer for the Debwewin Stories presentation on December 2, 2013 by Susan Dion - Distributed a flyer for the Winter Celebration taking place on December 17th, 2013 and invited everyone to drop in. <p>Facility Meeting</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Brockton is being considered for a larger purpose, Bloor Collegiate will be moving into 90 Croatia Street building in September 2016. - Jim Spyropoulos provided clarification regarding any rumors of the Aboriginal Education Centre moving out and stated that 90 Croatia Street is the home of the Aboriginal Education Centre and that no one has decided that the AEC will move at this time. <p>Items for Discussion:</p> <p>Bonnie Johnston</p>	<p>First Nations School of Toronto ~ Feasibility Study Updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The research study is ongoing - The questionnaire was distributed and is still available online - Plan is to go into Eastview Public School in the New Year to gather additional community feedback - Opened the floor to questions/concerns. Bonnie will forward comments/concerns to Susan Dion. <p>Jim introduced John Chasty.</p> <p>John Chasty gave a PowerPoint presentation on the information regarding the NAC 10 course</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Please see Appendix for John’s PowerPoint - Online courses are offered to native students - Ed Sackaney and Susan Dion have been instrumental in teaching non-Aboriginal teachers about the history and Aboriginal perspectives. <p>Questions that arose from presentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Christine wanted to know visually where are the schools are located - Eastern Commerce is the new home where the TDSB arts and collections will be displayed; it will be more of an exhibit. The opening will likely be the 3rd week in February and they will be hiring an Aboriginal curator who will go through the archives and collections. When this opens, Aboriginal artists will be brought in and 	Jim to connect with Carol and get a scatter map to visually see the schools.

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<p>Guest Presentation – John Chasty</p>	<p>provide art classes for Aboriginal students.</p> <p>Funding priorities – John asked the committee if they have any other ideas and if they should continue with the current number of schools or should they expand? He asked the committee to think about this and provide him with any feedback. Tanya Senk added that they want to execute this program in the right way and are concerned of growing too quickly, what to ensure cultural appropriation and have a collaborative approach. And want to move forward in a way that is appropriate and respectful.</p> <p>Rob Lackie inquired as to where the money to support the program is coming from and the response was from the Ministry.</p> <p>Marilyn asked how the schools got involved and the response was if they agreed to participate they were in. Another question was how much training did they receive before implementing the program and the response was 6 full days in total of training. There was a suggestion that the training take place in August when the teachers are returning from holidays and prepping for classes and that there is additional training so they are more confident teaching the material. It was also suggested that the same pool of teachers who are committed to the program for at least 3 years. There were further concerns on the TDSB's ability to continually fund the program and to that it was explained that the funding was predictable from year to year and that the Toronto Catholic School Board used the same model and after seeing the feasibility funds were allocated to the program.</p> <p>Marilyn suggested that John consult with the Elders and have them present at the trainings in case there are questions about the Métis and culture. John thanked Marilyn for the good suggestion.</p> <p>Bela asked how many of the 35 teachers were involved in the AEC and the response was 7. Rochelle Allan felt that it would be better to train teachers before August 31st as it is a good way to look at the goals of the pilot. And that the focus at this time should be on the proper training of the teachers not expanding the program. Tanya thanked the group for their suggestions and their feedback will be presented to the Métis counselor and the other organizations.</p> <p>There was some debate as to why this program had not been brought to the Committee before and Bela said that this program was discussed last spring and during former ACAC meetings since then.</p> <p>Ed Sackaney's Discussion Paper</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ed made a request to the TDSB to change the way that they refer to the Aboriginal community; to refrain from using words like "our Aboriginal people" it sounds like the Aboriginal people belong to them and that is incorrect. The same with the word "chief" as it is currently used by TDSB in various job titles. - A group of elders met with Carleton University, who are developing a program for corporations to get to know the community in their area and the same is being offered to the Aboriginal community to learn about the corporate structure. He wanted to know if this is an initiative the TDSB could offer it could be beneficial for the TDSB. - He mentioned that he needs help and would like to form an elder's forum for the TDSB which would meet 4 times a year. - He suggested that the TDSB refrain from using the word museum for the artifacts at Eastern Commerce, there is a bad history with Museums and the Aboriginal community where they have historical artifacts that have never been returned to the community. He suggested that they call it Interpretative Centre or something else besides museum. - Ed spoke about the need for TDSB to modify their hiring practices to be inclusive of hiring more Aboriginal peoples internally and externally. 	

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Ed Sackaney	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Rob Lackie mentioned that part of the issue is that teachers they want in the program are not certified with the O.C.T. and so he asked Trustee Rutka if there are any roles that could be created that could go around certification. - Trustee Rutka explained that certain processes are in place to ensure the quality of the program and asked the committee what is the process in their community for teachers to be considered qualified to teach. - Ed commended John for his leadership and that he is not just talk but walks the talk. - Ed mentioned that even Jim has come a long way and taken the time to learn and understand how the community works, and acknowledged that at the same time Jim is limited as he is bound by the system. - In conclusion, if ACAC members are going to be a part of Ed's discussion paper sub-committee, they should make sure to have an alternate who can and will attend these meetings on a consistent basis. - Bela closed the discussion by requesting the committee to forward any questions or comments to Ed directly.
